and Projects.


8 Care Community Event

Project Round-up

Radway Project

The Radway Estate in Alsager has been identified as being in the top 20% of the most deprived areas in the country, experiencing many social, environmental and health issues affecting the residents living there. Questionnaires have been sent out to residents to gain a better understanding of the issues and barriers to accessing support, to gain some clarity to the problems currently being faced in the community. A meeting has been held with Cheshire East Connected Communities, SMASH Care Community and 14 residents off the estate to talk in more detail about these issues, which include ASB and crime, the estate being rundown, housing issues, and access to services. Drugs and alcohol dependency were raised as a concern, including drug dealing in the streets, mental health, special educational needs (both adults and <u>children</u> / young people), a<u>nd</u> underlying a lot of the problems is the fact that for most of this support, people must travel out of Alsager and without a car. Our next step is to meet the Police, Plus Dane Housing and the Town Council to discuss the issues further with a focus on solutions and a collaborative plan to improve the health and wellbeing of the residents. Flexible Fund for survivors of domestic abuse

Women's Aid is pleased to be working with the Home Office, our membership and sector partners to help distribute an additional funding to provide one-off payments to survivors of domestic abuse to help them flee their abuser, and to increase their stability and independence following on from a successful pilot distributed in May 2023.

From Wednesday 31st January 2024 until Sunday 31st March 2024 survivors of domestic abuse who do not have the financial means to leave their abuser or to remain safely at home, will be able to apply for a one - off payment of up to £500 for essential items such as groceries and nappies.

First time survivors can also a apply for a further payment of up to £2500 to help secure a sustainable future.

You may have heard from the news over recent months of a new service launching TODAY 31st January called 'Pharmacy First'.

This is part of the NHS delivery plan for recovering access to primary care for minor health concerns. Under the scheme, appropriately trained pharmacists will be able to prescribe prescription-only medicines for seven conditions.

We are pleased to announce that this service is available to our PATIENTS.

Our RECEPTION team will take information regarding your symptoms, depending on your clinical history & symptoms we may refer you on to Pharmacy First. The conditions that Pharmacy First can treat are ear infections, impetigo, infected insect bites, shingles, sinusitis, sore throats, & uncomplicated urinary tract infections in females. We are communicating with pharmacies in the area who are able to

Grief is a normal, natural response to loss and bereavement that everyone will experience at some point in their life. Many of us, however, have a very limited understanding of how grief can affect our feelings, thoughts, behaviours and physical health.

This is particularly true of anticipatory grief, or grief before death, which can arise due to loss of companionship, loss of future plans and dreams or loss of role and identity, even when the cared for person is still present.

A better understanding of "anticipatory grief" for the carer and the person being cared for
