We believe refugees bring valuable skills and ideas. We want to help you live independently and be part of our community.

We can help refugees or evacuees resettled in Cheshire East and people who arrived through Family Reunion or Community Sponsorship.



How Can We Help You?

- Learn English.
- Register for health, housing, school, and library services.
- Understand letters and bills.
- Go with you to appointments and explain what you need to do next.
- Help you explore your town, find shops, and join activities.
- Sometimes provide furniture or equipment.
- Connect you with other helpful services.

How Do We Help?

- English practice: Weekly group ESOL classes. We also offer one-to-one English practice in person or via Zoom.
- Family Support: Families can be supported by a small team of volunteers to help you settle in and access services.
- Additional Support: Other volunteers, Trustees, or our Volunteer Supervisor may also assist.
- Working with Other Organisations: We work with agencies like Cheshire East Council, schools, and Citizens Advice. We only share your information with your permission.

- We do not provide housing.
- We do not give financial support (except in special cases, like for school uniforms).
- We do not manage your money or payments.
- We do not give advice on benefits, finances, or legal/immigration matters.

- Who We Are: Volunteers who are not paid, but we are dedicated to helping you.
- Why We Help: We want you to become an independent member of the community and have the chance to rebuild your life and fulfil your potential.



Your Role in Making This Work

- Respect Volunteers: Volunteers give their time to help you. Be respectful and give them your full attention when they come to meet you.
- Communicate Honestly: Tell us about your needs so we can help you better. We understand it can be extremely difficult to leave your country and family. We won't ask you to talk about things that make you uncomfortable, but the more you tell us, the better we can help.
- Tell Us About Other Help: Let us know if you are getting help from other organisations. This will help us avoid repeating the same support and reduce confusion.

Your Responsibilities

• Get to know your community and try to learn English as soon as you can.
